

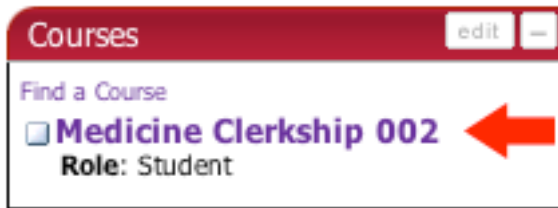
The following instructions outline the steps for submitting Case Write-ups through the Angel Course Management System using drop boxes set up for this purpose.

Step 1

Log in to Angel at <http://courses.med.cornell.edu> using your CWID.

Step 2

Locate the courses nugget on your homepage and click on the link for the Clerkship you are enrolled in.



Step 3

Click the link for "Course Materials" on the top menu bar. On the course materials page, click the link for the "Case Write-ups".

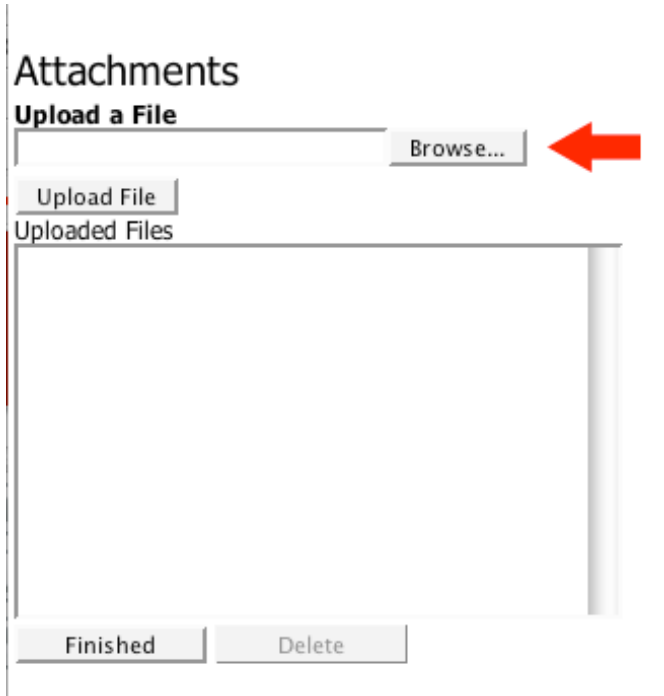

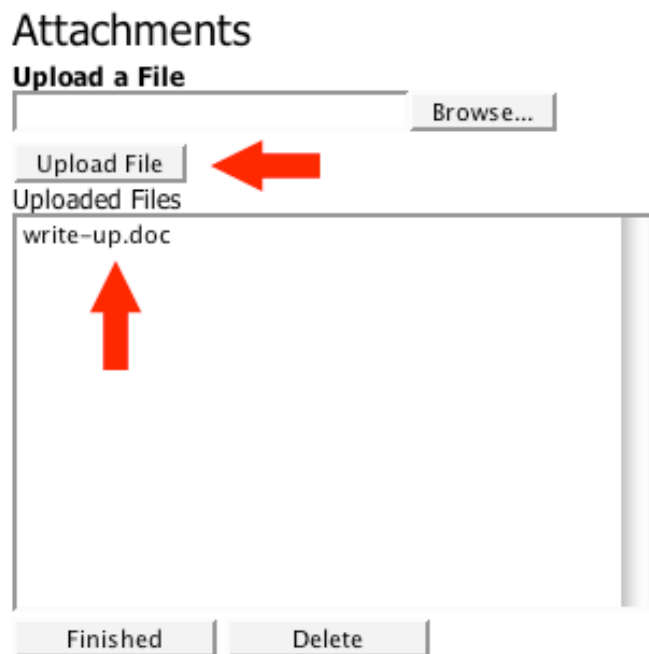
